### What is your favorite blooming shrub?

My favorite flowering shrub is the Old-Fashioned Lilac. I have fond memories of going out to my parents' side yard on Mother's Day morning and gathering tons of them, their giant pink-purple heads still dripping with morning dew. The scent has always been intoxicating to me.

#### What is your favorite annual?

I have so many favorite annuals, it's hard to pick just one. I guess it has to be Coleus. I grow several varieties in my garden containers every year and they are some of the last that I pull out in late fall. I always make sure to include some varieties from the Color Blaze series like 'Torchlight', 'Sedona Sunset' and 'Wicked Witch'.

### Winter-Proof Your Houseplants

4 EASY TIPS TO KEEP THEM THRIVING ALL SEASON

As the days get shorter and temperatures drop, our houseplants feel the seasonal shift just like we do. While they might not bundle up in cozy sweaters, they do need a little extra care to stay healthy and happy through the winter months. Here's how you can help your indoor jungle thrive when the weather outside is frightful.



#### LIGHTEN UP THEIR SPACE

Winter means less sunlight, which can make your plants look a bit droopy. Move them closer to windows where they can soak up as much natural light as possible. If your home lacks sunny spots, consider using a grow light to keep them bright and perky.



#### WATCH THE WATERING

Your plants don't need as much water in winter since they grow more slowly. Overwatering is a common mistake—let the top inch or two of soil dry out before giving them a drink. Always check the soil first, and remember, it's better to underwater than overwater during the colder months.



### KEEP THEM COZY (BUT NOT TOO WARM)

Most houseplants prefer to be in temperatures between 60 - 75°F. Keep them away from drafty windows, cold air, and heating vents that can cause sudden temperature changes. A stable, cozy spot will help them adjust smoothly to winter indoors.



### **BOOST THE HUMIDITY**

Winter air can be dry, and your tropical plants will miss the humidity. You can mist them occasionally, group them together to create a mini greenhouse effect, or place a humidifier nearby. Even placing a tray of water and pebbles under your plants can make a big difference.

With just a little extra attention, your houseplants can breeze through winter and be ready to bloom come spring. Happy growing!



## Roses & Romance

### HOW THE RED ROSE BECAME A VALENTINE'S DAY ICON

As Valentine's Day approaches, lovebirds everywhere are busy pondering the perfect gift to express their feelings. For many, the classic choice is a dozen stunning red roses—the quintessential emblem of romance. But what makes these blooms so iconic? How did a simple bouquet of red roses come to symbolize deep love and desire? While other blooms like tulips, lilies, and peonies certainly have their charm and can be wonderful gifts on this special day, red roses reign supreme in the realm of romance. Their prominence stems from a rich history, profound cultural significance, and a bit of clever marketing.

### The Origins of Gifting Roses

Roses, beloved symbols of love and beauty, boast a history that's as rich and vibrant as their petals. With fossil evidence tracing back to an astonishing 35 million years ago, these enchanting flowers belong to a lineage that includes over 150 species thriving across the Northern Hemisphere. The journey of cultivating roses for gardens and commercial use began around 5,000 years ago, with ancient China at the forefront of this blossoming **trend**, as noted by researchers from the University of Illinois (University of Illinois Extension., n.d.).

During the grandeur of the Greek and Roman eras, roses truly came into their own. These exquisite blooms graced the lavish public gardens of the Middle East, where they were cherished not just for their beauty but also for their versatility—used in perfumes and as confetti to shower celebrations in a burst of color. Doesn't that sound familiar to certain present day traditions (I'll give you a hint, it's Valentines Day & Weddings)?

As their popularity soared, roses wove their way into the fabric of mythology. To the Greeks, they were a symbol of Aphrodite, the goddess of love and beauty. The Romans adopted this passion, associating roses with both Venus, the goddess of love, beauty, and fertility, and Persephone, the goddess of spring (Duke University Arts & Humanities., n.d.).

However, after the fall of the Roman Empire, the rose's prominence waned, resting in the

shadows—until the Medieval and Renaissance periods brought it back into the limelight. Roses, specifically red roses (even more specifically the Apothecary's Rose, a red rose very popular in the Medieval period also known as the Damask Rose), became popular gesture for courtship and romance (National Trust Mottisfont, 2014). Roses also began to see its way into art and literature solidifying its position as a symbol of love. The journey of the rose is a captivating tale that reminds us of the timeless admiration we hold for these exquisite flowers.

### Roses & Valentine's Day

As roses continued to symbolize love and passion, their association with Valentine's Day began to take shape. The roots of this romantic holiday trace back to St. Valentine, a Roman priest who, according to legend, defied Emperor Claudius II's ban on marriages and secretly wed young couples. Some versions of the story claim that Valentine himself sent a love note signed "From your Valentine" (Farndon, 2000), cementing his

role as the patron saint of lovers. the mid-18th century, By Valentine's Day as we know it was well established, with couples exchanging handwritten love notes and small tokens of affection. It was during the Victorian era, however, that the tradition of gifting flowers-especially red roses-became a widespread practice. The Victorians were with floriography, enamored or the "language of flowers," a system that assigned meanings to different blooms (Seaton, 1995).

Red roses, with their deep crimson hue, were universally understood to convey deep love, passion, and desire—a message perfectly suited for Valentine's Day.

As society progressed, so did the floral industry's ability to commercialize romance. In the early 20th century, florists and advertisers began marketing red roses as the ultimate Valentine's Day gift. At Bayport Flower Houses, our connection to roses runs deep—before shifting our focus to homegrown potted plants, we cultivated roses to supply the New York City markets as they became more popular.

Our history with rose cultivation reflects a longstanding love for these timeless blooms, making their significance on Valentine's Day even more special. Their widespread appeal led to the enduring tradition of presenting a dozen red roses as the ultimate romantic gesture (FTD, 2023). Today, millions of roses are sold worldwide every February 14th, cementing their status as the undisputed symbol of love (SAF, 2023).

### Why a Dozen Roses?

But why twelve? The number 12 has long been associated with completeness and perfection, appearing in various cultural, religious, and natural cyclesthink of 12 months in a year, 12 zodiac signs, and 12 hours on a clock (Greenaway, 1884). A dozen roses not only looks visually balanced in a bouquet but also carries the meaning of wholeness and devotion—a perfect way to say, "You mean the world to me."

Still, the tradition of giving a dozen red roses endures, reminding us that some symbols of love are simply timeless like our Elegance arrangement.
